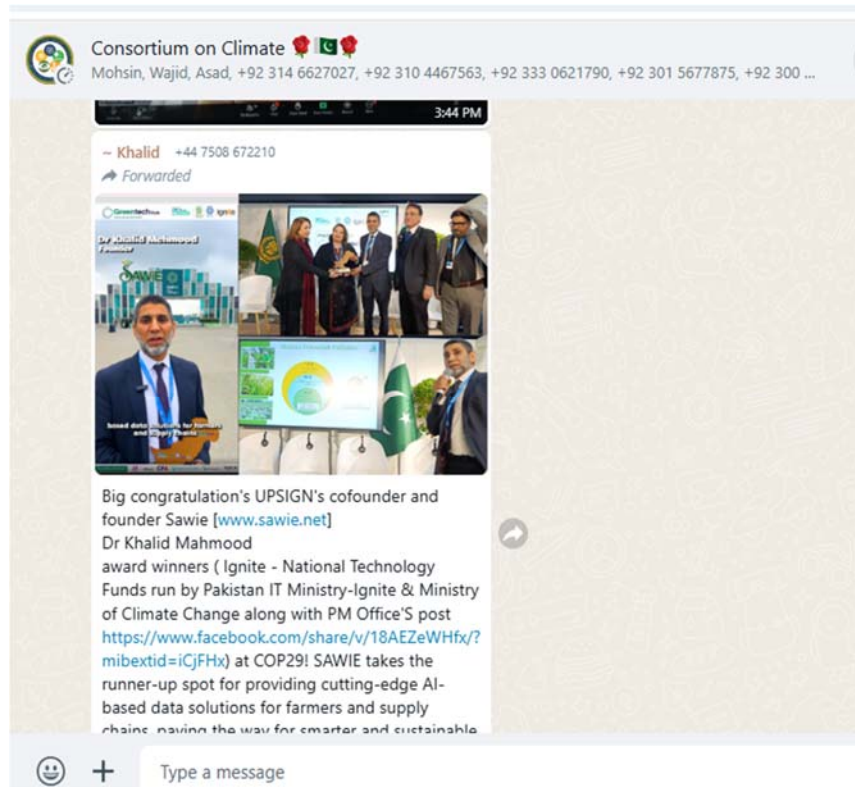


Collaborative Efforts with NGOs in Climate Adaptation Strategies


University of Poonch: Empowering Global Sustainability through Collaborative NGO Partnerships within CCSC
